We sang together and talked nonstop switching from English to Russian, Russian to Ukrainian, Polish to Spanish and back. Children played the piano; adults played guitars and even Russian balalaika. This is our first step before we introduce the new group to the congregation. In December, we plan to have a traditional Christmas celebration for children. God is at work in St. Joseph!
